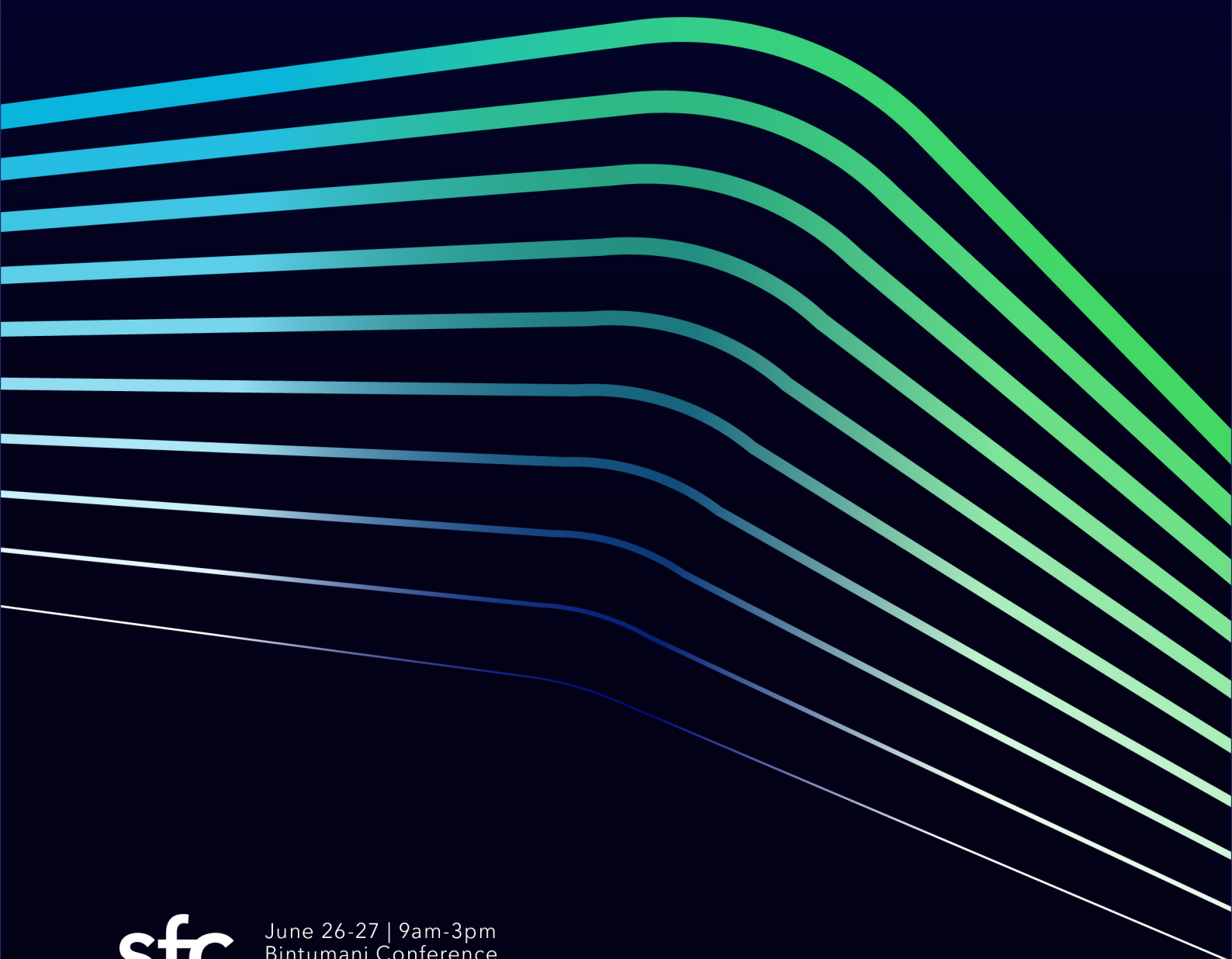

03 There are several important aspects of stable family environments ensuring children's well-being and early socialization, such as secure attachment and the process of the transmission and acquisition of values.

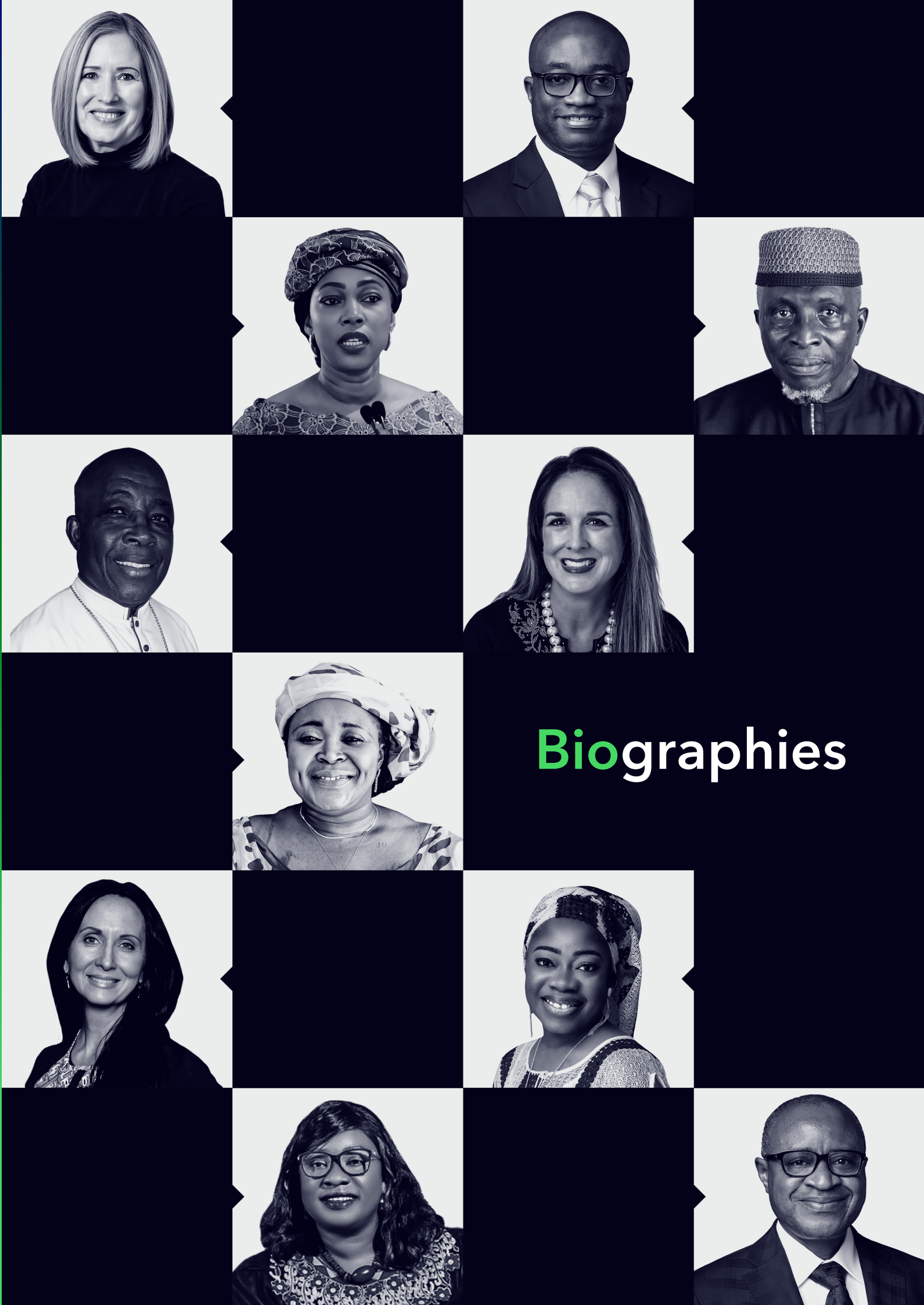
04 Research demonstrates that children who developed secure attachment relationships in their families are more self-reliant and empathetic adults.

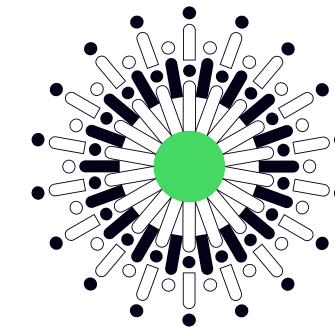
The motivation of organizing the Strengthening Families Conference is to

HIS EXCELLENCY **JULIUS MAADA BIO**

President of the Republic of Sierra Leone

Early Life and Education

His Excellency Julius Maada Wonie Bio was born on May 12, 1964, in Tihun, Sierra Leone. He is a product of Sierra Leone's educational system, with a strong commitment to academic excellence. Bio pursued higher education at the Fourah Bay College, University of Sierra Leone, where he earned his Bachelor's degree in Mathematics. He then furthered his education at The Royal Military Academy Sandhurst in the United Kingdom, where he graduated as an officer of the Sierra Leone Army. Military Service and Leadership in Sierra Leone's Peace Process

Bio's military career began in the 1980s, and by 1996, he had risen to the rank of Brigadier General in the Sierra Leone Army. He became widely recognized for his leadership in a turbulent period in the country's history. On January 16, 1996, following the overthrow of the country's previous military government, Bio led a military coup that brought him to the helm of the National Provisional Ruling Council

(NPRC). As Head of State, he played a pivotal role in facilitating the peace process that eventually brought an end to Sierra Leone's devastating civil war.

Under his leadership, Bio championed the transition to a democratically elected government. His decision to hand over power to a civilian government in March 1996 is widely regarded as a significant contribution to the country's return to peace and stability.

Political Career and Presidency

After stepping down from his military leadership in 1996, Bio shifted his focus to politics, joining the Sierra Leone People's Party (SLPP). He ran for the presidency in 2012 and, after a determined campaign, was elected as President in 2018.

His inauguration on May 12, 2018, marked a new chapter in the country's journey toward democratic consolidation and sustainable development. As the 5th President of Sierra Leone, Bio's leadership has been characterized by his commitment to human capital development, good governance, and national transformation.

Key Initiatives and Achievements as President

- **Free Quality Education Program:**
Upon assuming office, President Bio launched the Free Quality Education program, a flagship initiative aimed at providing free education from primary to secondary school for all children in Sierra Leone. The program prioritizes girls' education, particularly in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) fields, ensuring that young Sierra Leoneans are equipped with the skills needed to thrive in the 21st century.
 - **Fight against Corruption:**
Bio has led an aggressive campaign to tackle corruption in Sierra Leone. His administration has strengthened the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC), improving its capacity to investigate and prosecute corrupt activities. Under his leadership, the government has recovered significant amounts of looted funds, marking a success in improving financial accountability and transparency in the public sector.
 - **Economic Reforms and Technical Education:**
In line with his vision for a competitive and self-reliant nation, President Bio has prioritized technical and vocational education, launching the Ministry of Technical and Higher Education. This initiative is aimed at empowering Sierra Leone's youth with the necessary skills to thrive in the global job market, especially in sectors such as renewable energy, information technology, and engineering.
4. **Governance and Institutional Reforms:**
In his first term, President Bio has streamlined government operations by establishing a Single Treasury Account (STA), which centralizes all government revenues and expenditures. This reform has improved financial management, ensuring the effective use of public funds for development programs.
- **Sierra Leone's Leadership in ECOWAS**
Sierra Leone's President Julius Maada Bio was chosen on Sunday to be the next chairman of the West African economic bloc, ECOWAS. This appointment highlights Sierra Leone's growing influence in regional governance. Under President Bio's leadership, the country has become a strong advocate for democratic

governance, peacebuilding, and regional integration.

As the new Chairman of ECOWAS in June 2024, President Bio is set to lead the bloc toward greater economic collaboration, security cooperation, and democratic stability in West Africa.

In addition to his leadership in ECOWAS, President Bio has strengthened Sierra Leone's presence on the global stage. As a member of the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), Sierra Leone, under Bio's leadership, has been an advocate for peace, security, and human rights across the globe. Sierra Leone's membership on the UNSC has allowed the country to play a significant role in peacekeeping and conflict resolution, reinforcing Bio's legacy as a leader committed to regional and international peace.

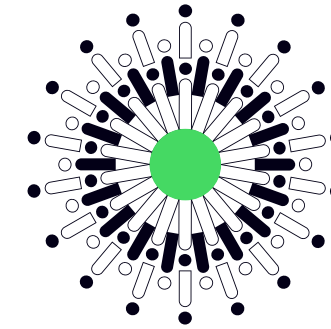
• Vision for the Future

President Bio remains focused on ensuring that Sierra Leone continues its path of economic growth, good governance, and regional leadership. His government's priorities include further development of human capital, the promotion of foreign direct investment (FDI), and the expansion of infrastructure, especially in energy, agriculture, and technology sectors. Bio's leadership continues to inspire a new generation of Sierra Leoneans who are poised to contribute to both the national economy and regional cooperation.

President Bio is married to Sia Nyama Koroma, and together they have children. He is known for his humble beginnings and remains deeply connected to his roots in Bonthe District, Sierra Leone. Outside of politics, President Bio enjoys reading, sports, and spending time with his family.





HER EXCELLENCY **FATIMA MAADA BIO**

First Lady of the Republic of Sierra Leone

First Lady, Madam Fatima Maada Bio is motivated by pan-Africanist ideals. She is a strong believer in women empowerment as key to sustainable development. She pursued her passion for women empowerment as First Lady by staging a peaceful protest against gender based violence. It was a historic march as First Ladies from different African Countries came together in unity in a protest march on the streets of Freetown in December 2018. This was the beginning of her very powerful campaign themed “Hands Off Our Girls”.

Born into the madingo tribal circle, she knew who her husband would be at age 10. She narrowly escaped Child marriage and started philanthropic work at a very tender age of 16. She relocated to London where she pursued her passion for charity work. Her personal story is her main motivation and she has traveled the world providing support to vulnerable children, especially in Africa.

First Lady Fatima Bio has Bachelors of Art degree in Performing Art from the Roehampton Institute of London and in Journalism from the University of Arts, London College of Communication. Worthy of note about Sierra Leone’s illustrious first lady is the niche she has garnered for herself through hard-work over the years in the entertainment

industry as an actress, script Writer, executive producer and a multi award winning face of Nollywood industry. Among her barrage of prominent features in cinema is the ‘Mirror Boy’.

First Lady Maada Bio has received several awards including;

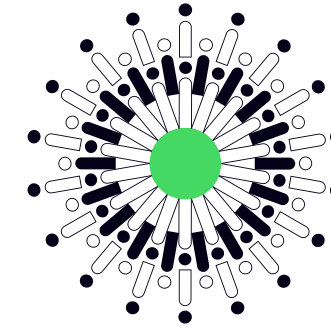

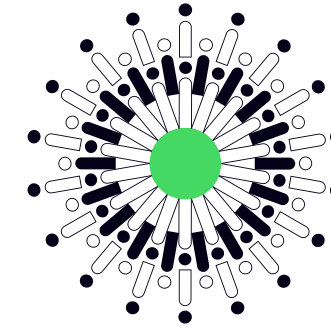
Elder Alfred Kyungu Kibamba was born in Kamina, Democratic Republic of the Congo. Elder Kyungu received a bachelor of science degree in social sciences and international relations from the University of Lubumbashi in 1993. In 1996, he received a master of science degree in social sciences and international relations from the University of Lubumbashi.

Elder Alfred Kyungu has worked in several positions for the Democratic Republic of the Congo government, including youth coordinator, private secretary, and administrative councilor. Prior to his call as a mission president, he worked for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints as coordinator and regional director for seminaries and institutes. At the time of his call as a General Authority Seventy, he had been working for the Church as a family history manager.

Elder Alfred Kyungu has served in a number of Church callings, including district executive secretary, district clerk, branch Sunday School

president, institute teacher, ward Sunday School teacher, counselor in a bishopric, high councilor, ward Sunday School president, counselor in a stake presidency, and president of the Democratic Republic of the Congo Mbuji-Mayi Mission from 2016 to 2019.

Elder Alfred Kyungu was sustained as a General Authority Seventy of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on April 3, 2021. At the time of his call, he had been serving as a member of the Third Quorum of the Seventy in the Africa Central Area. He served as a member of the Third Quorum of the Seventy in the Africa Southeast Area from 2011 to 2016. He served at Church headquarters as an area assistant to the North America Central Area and as an Assistant Executive Director in the Temple Department. He is currently serving as president of the Africa West Area.

Second Counselor in Africa West Area Presidency

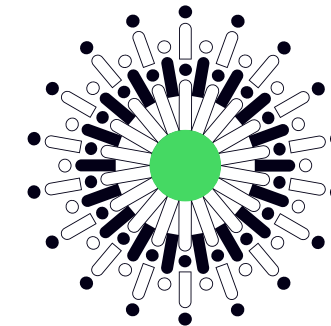

Elder Isaac Kofi Morrison was born in Takoradi, Ghana. Elder Morrison received a higher national diploma (HND) in building construction from Takoradi Technical University (TTU) in 2000 and a bachelor of science in operations and project management from the Ghana Institute of Management and Public Administration (GIMPA) in 2009. In 2018 he received a master of science in strategic management and leadership from Kwame Nkrumah University of Science and Technology (KNUST).

He worked for the Church in various positions since 2004, including as a Ghana MTC instructor, meetinghouse facilities manager, Accra Ghana temple facilities manager, Africa West Area operations and maintenance manager, and Africa West Area materials management manager. Prior to his call as a mission president, he had been working for the Church Africa West Area leader and member support.

Elder Morrison has served in a number of Church callings, including full-time missionary in the Nigeria Port Harcourt and Nigeria Uyo Mission, Gospel Doctrine teacher, seminary teacher, elders quorum president, counselor in a bishopric, bishop, counselor in a stake presidency, stake president, Area Seventy, and mission president.

Elder Isaac K. Morrison was sustained as a General Authority Seventy of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints on April 2, 2022. At the time of his call, he had been serving as the president of the Ghana Cape Coast Mission. He served as a member of the Third Quorum of the Seventy in the Africa West Area from 2018 to 2020. He is currently serving in the Africa West Area Presidency.



ARCHBISHOP **EDWARD TAMBA CHARLES**

Archbishop of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of
Freetown, Sierra Leone. President-IRCSL

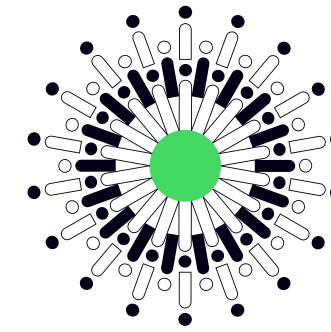
Edward Tamba Charles was born in Kainkordu, Diocese of Kenema, Sierra Leone. He studied at Saint Kizito Minor Seminary in Kenema, then later studied at the Saint Paul's Major Seminary in Gbarnga, in Gbarnga, Bong County, Liberia from 1978 until 1985. Later in his life, he studied at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, Italy from 1991 until 1996, where he graduated with a Licentiate in dogmatic theology.

Archbishop Edward Tamba Charles was ordained a priest on 4 April 1986. He was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Kenema, Sierra Leone and served in that capacity until 15 March 2008. He was appointed archbishop on 15 March 2008 by Pope Benedict XVI and was consecrated at Freetown on 14 May 2008. When the Roman Catholic Diocese of Bo was erected on 15 January 2011, he became Archbishop of Freetown.

Before the erection of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Bo in 2011, he was the archbishop of the Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Freetown

and Bo, in Sierra Leone, from 15 March 2008 until 15 January 2011. 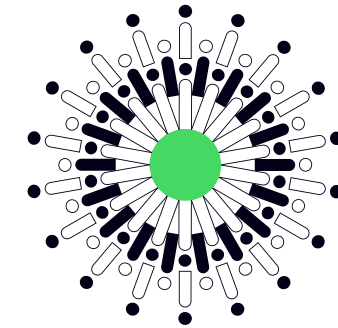

He is also the Bishop of the Second Diocese, with jurisdiction over Sierra Leone, Nigeria, and Ghana, where he provides spiritual oversight to more than 150 churches and 14 public schools in Sierra Leone. With a vision to expand the reach of the gospel, he has embarked on an ambitious mission to plant 1,000 more churches in towns and villages across the region.

In 2004, she led a community coalition of parents, coaches, nurses, pastors, and teens in the development of the ESTEEM curriculum (Encouraging Students to Embrace Excellent Marriage), which is centered around content that promotes risk avoidance. ESTEEM is currently being used in 77 Texas public school districts and, starting this year, seven districts outside of Texas. In 2006, Tonya and Justin initiated the VOW-Healthy Marriage program, a 12-hour course designed to rebuild marriages at risk of divorce and train mentors to facilitate Engaged Couple Workshops.

Tonya has been interviewed by and quoted in Reader's Digest, the New York Times, and Newsweek. She has been on the BBC, NPR, and The Today Show, including a one-hour special on ABC's 20/20 Primetime. She has served as an Executive Board member for the Texas Coalition for Healthy Families (TCHF) and was a founding member of the National Alliance for Relationship and Marriage Education (NARME), The Abstinence Council of Texas (ACT), and is a board member of ASCEND, a national sexual risk avoidance organization. He is the executive director for Rainbo-Initiatives and a development professional with over 18 years experience in the Not for Profit Sector. He leads an organization that is a global example of a local Initiative. Passionate about ending Sexual and Gender-Based (SGBV).

Mr. Kemokai has over the years gained substantial knowledge and experience in the field of child rights and policy development. He drafted the first National Standards for the Protection of Children in the Criminal Justice System in Sierra Leone in 2006 and the National Referral Protocol on Gender Based Violence against children in 2008. He has been part of working groups or taskforces set up by the government of Sierra Leone to draft several national policies and bills that have been passed by the government of Sierra Leone. This includes the Child Rights Act 2007, the Sexual Offences Act 2012, amended in 2019,

the child justice strategies and the current Child Rights bill 2025. Mr. Kemokai was part of the Technical and Scientific Committee that supervised the drafting of the Guidelines on Action for Children in the Justice System in Africa in 2011, which has been adopted by the African Committee of Experts on the Rights and Welfare of Children. 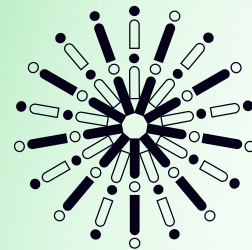

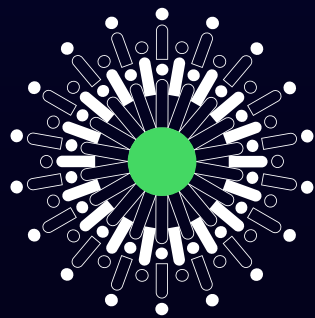
